## CITY COUNCIL CORNER

Each month we will keep you informed of the City Council decisions from the previous month. In June:

- Approved an amendment to the Lafonzo Estates Minor Subdivision located at 645 North Main, dividing the parcel into three lots.
- Held public hearings regarding the budgets for fiscal years 2009-2010 and 2010-2011 and also a revision to the Millville City Code deleting the chapter regarding Home Occupations, Ordinance 17.48; and also Revising the Administrative Reviews and Permit Processing regarding Sign Permits, Ordinance 17.80.020.
- The Council approved the budgets as well as the revision to Ordinance 17.48 and 17.80.020.
- The RAPZ Population allocation allotted to Millville City was identified and will be used to pay for the new park pavilion to be built on the north end of the City Park.
- Discussed the details for the Sesquicentennial Celebration.

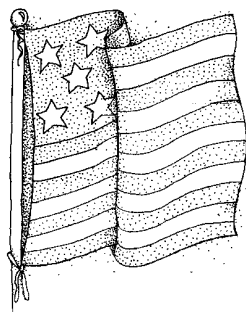

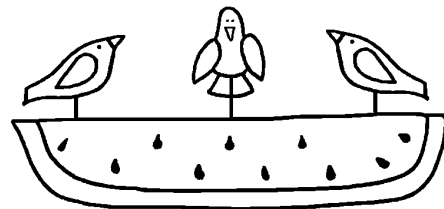
