EARLY VOTING SCHEDULE FOR MILLVILLE CITY 2009 MUNICIPAL ELECTION

Millville City registered voters wishing to take part in the early voting process may do so at the Millville City Office, 510 East 300 South, Millville, Utah, during the following dates and times as specified: Tuesday, October 20 – 9 a.m. to 1 p.m.; Wednesday, October 21 – 3 p.m. to 7 p.m.; Thursday, October 22 – 9 a.m. to 1 p.m.; Friday, October 23 – 7 a.m. to 11 a.m.; Tuesday, October 27 – 9 a.m. to 1 p.m.; Wednesday, October 28 – 3 p.m. to 7 p.m.; Thursday, October 29 – 9 a.m. to 1 p.m.; and Friday, October 30 – 1 p.m. to 5 p.m.

INFO ON UPCOMING ELECTION

During the last legislature session, House Bill 126 was passed which requires all voters to present "**a valid voter identification**" when voting at the polls on Election Day. **DON'T BE CAUGHT OFF GUARD. PLEASE BRING YOUR VALID VOTER IDENTIFICATION.** "Valid voter identification" means: a form of identification that bears the name and photograph of the voter which may include: a currently valid Utah driver license; a currently valid identification card that is issued by: the state; or a branch, department or agency of the United States; a currently valid Utah permit to carry a concealed weapon; a currently valid United States passport; or a valid tribal identification card, whether or not the card includes a photograph of the voter; two forms of identification that bear the name of the voter and provide evidence that the voter resides in the voting precinct, which may include: a current utility bill or a legible copy thereof, dated within the 90 days before the election; a bank or other financial account statement, or a legible copy thereof; a certified birth certificate; a valid Social Security card; a check issued by the state or the federal government or a legible copy thereof; a paycheck from the voter's employer, or a legible copy thereof; a currently valid Utah hunting or fishing license; a currently valid United States military identification card; certified naturalization documentation; a currently valid license issued by an authorized agency of the United States; a certified copy of court records showing the voter's adoption or name change; a Bureau of Indian Affairs card; a tribal treaty card; a valid Medicaid card, Medicare card, or Electronic Benefits Transfer Card; a currently valid identification card issued by: a local government within the state; an employer of an employee; or a college, university, technical school, or professional school located within the state; a current Utah vehicle registration; or a form of identification listed in Subsection (76)(a) that does not contain a photograph, but establishes the name



of the voter and provides evidence that the voter resides in the voting precinct, if at least one other form of identification listed in Subsection (76)(b)(i) through (xv) is also presented.

BE CAUTIOUS ABOUT GIVING INFO TO CENSUS WORKERS

With the U.S. Census process beginning, the Better Business Bureau (BBB) advises people to be cooperative, but cautious, so as not to become a victim of fraud or identity theft. The first phase of the 2010 U.S. Census is under way, as workers have begun verifying the addresses of households across the country. Eventually, more than 140,000 U.S. Census workers will count every person in the United

States and will gather information about every person living at each address including name, age, gender, race, and other relevant data. The big question is - how do you tell the difference between a U.S. Census worker and a con artist? BBB offers the following advice: If a U.S. Census worker knocks on your door, they will have a badge, a handheld device, a Census Bureau canvas bag, and a confidentiality notice. Ask to see their identification and their badge before answering their questions. However, you should never invite anyone you do not know into your home. Census workers are currently only knocking on doors to verify address information. Do not give your Social Security number, credit card or banking information to anyone, even if they claim they need it for the U.S. Census. While the Census Bureau might ask for basic financial information, such as a salary range, it will not ask for Social Security, bank account, or credit card numbers nor will employees solicit donations. Eventually, Census workers may contact you by telephone, mail, or in person at home. However, they will not contact you by Email, so be on the lookout for Email scams impersonating the Census. Never click on a link or open any attachments in an Email that are supposedly from the U.S. Census Bureau.
