Each month we will keep you informed of the City Council decisions from the previous month. In April:

- Reviewed the 2009 Building Report as presented by Don Davis of the Cache County Building Department.
- Received an update on services provided by Questar as presented by Steve Krebs.
- Considered a subdivision for the Iverson Subdivision for property north of Center Street and west of 100 West.
- Heard a report on the fire services as presented by the Hyrum City Fire Department.
- Reviewed and accepted a proposal for the expenditure of the unused bond funds from the Division of Drinking Water as presented by Engineer Zan Murray with J-U-B. This proposal was to complete the Hydraulic Modeling Report as required by the state.

Nibley-Millville First Responders/Squad 140

From January 2010 through March 2010, Nibley-Millville First Responder Emergency Medical Technicians (EMTs) responded to 25 medical emergencies, 10 of which were in Millville. During that same time, we put in 2,160 hours on-call and worked 180 shifts. We train monthly and are honored to provide emergency medical care to our fellow citizens. We are recruiting new members who are committed to serve their communities by providing volunteer pre-hospital emergency care. Applicants must hold a current EMT Basic (or Intermediate/Paramedic) certificate from the Utah Bureau of Emergency Medical Services **OR** be willing to attend and successfully complete an EMT Basic course in Utah.
