CITY COUNCIL CORNER

Each month we will keep you informed of the City Council decisions from the previous month. In December:

- Approved the Mond-Aire Subdivision Phase 2, located at approximately 380 East to 550 East and 225 North to Center Street.
- Approved issuing building permits in the Mond-Aire Subdivision Phase 1.
- Held a public hearing and approved revisions to the 2016 fiscal year budget.
- Accepted the Financial Audit Report for 2015 as presented.
- Approved the 2016 Annual Meeting Schedule.
- Adopted a Resolution Establishing a Recycling Market Development Zone.
- Canceled the City Council Meeting to be held on December 24, 2015.
- Approved the Impact Fee Report and Certification.
- Reviewed information presented on updated impact fees proposed.
- Requested additional advertising time to give individuals the opportunity to bid on irrigation water. The bids will be due on January 22, 2016 and opened at the Council Meeting held on January 28, 2016.
- Held an executive session to discuss land acquisition.

2016 DOG LICENSES

The 2016 Dog Licenses are here! Remember the deadline for licensing your dog is March 1, 2016. Fees **double** after that date. Please mail your proof of rabies/proof of spay or neuter along with a payment to Millville City, P.O. Box 308, Millville, UT 84326. Up to three dogs, \$10 each if spayed/neutered and \$20 each if not spayed/neutered. Four to six dogs requires a kennel license fee of \$150. Six dogs is the limit! The dog clinic will be held on Saturday, February 6, 2016 from 9am-11am at the City Office building. POSTING PLACES FOR INFORMATION

There are three locations where information is posted within our city to keep you informed of upcoming meetings and events. They are: City Post Office – 70 West 200 North, City Office Building – 510 East 300 South, and the North Park Pavilion – 435 North 100 East.

MESSAGE FROM THE FIRE DEPARTMENT – During this time of year the Hyrum City Fire Department responds the most to carbon monoxide calls. The inversions, better insulated homes, attached garages, low or dead batteries and actual CO leaks all contribute to these calls. Carbon monoxide is by products from burning. When CO detectors, which have batteries, start to beep what does it mean? If it is an alarm it will sound loudly. If the detector beeps repeatedly about every 30 seconds it is probably the battery letting you know it is failing. Changing the battery should stop the noise. When changing the battery, check the manufacture date of your CO detector. Manufactures say the life is 7-10 years, but our department has seen detectors fail as early as 3 years. Also remember that CO detectors with an electric plug will also have a battery to back them up in case of power outages. Also, did you know that CO detectors need cleaning? Schedule a yearly date (possibly with the time change) to replace the batteries as well as cleaning/blowing out your detector. Keyboard air cans or just a good set of lungs will work. If all else fails, don't hesitate to call the Fire Department and we can respond and check your air with our meter.
