2015 DOG LICENSES

The 2015 Dog Licenses are here! Remember the deadline for licensing your dog is **March 1, 2015**. Fees double after that date. Please mail your proof of rabies/proof of spay or neuter along with a payment to Millville City, P.O. Box 308, Millville, UT 84326. Up to three dogs, \$10 each if spayed/neutered and \$20 each if not spayed/neutered. Four to six dogs requires a kennel license fee of \$150. Six dogs is the limit! MILLVILLE CITY NOTICE OF MUNICIPAL OFFICES TO BE VOTED ON

Millville City will hold a municipal election on November 3, 2015. There are three council seats for four-year terms that will be voted on. The councilmembers whose term of office will expire are: Michael Callahan, Cindy Cummings, and Mark Williams. The filing period will begin on June 1, 2015 and will conclude on June 8, 2015 at 5 p.m.

As outlined in the Utah State Code, the following outlines the eligibility requirements for those interested in declaring candidacy:

20A-9-203. Declarations of candidacy -- Municipal general elections.

(1) (a) (i) A person may become a candidate for any municipal office if:

(A) the person is a registered voter; and

(B) (I) the person has resided within the municipality in which that person seeks to hold elective office for the 12 consecutive months immediately before the date of the election; or

(II) if the territory in which the person resides was annexed into the municipality, the person has resided within the annexed territory or the municipality the 12 consecutive months immediately before the date of the election.

(ii) For purposes of determining whether a person meets the residency requirement of Subsection (1)(a)(i)(B)(I) in a municipality that was incorporated less than 12 months before the election, the municipality shall be considered to have been incorporated 12 months before the date of the election.

(b) In addition to the requirements of Subsection (1)(a), each candidate for a municipal council position shall, if elected from a district, be a resident of the council district from which elected.

(c) In accordance with Utah Constitution Article IV, Section 6, any mentally incompetent person, any person convicted of a felony, or any person convicted of treason or a crime against the elective franchise may not hold office in this state until the right to hold elective office is restored under Section 20A-2-101.3 or 20A-2-101.5.

THE HEAT PROGRAM

The HEAT Program is a federally funded assistance program designed to help low-income, elderly and disabled households with home energy costs.

The HEAT program is open Nov 1 through April 30th or until federal funds are exhausted.

Eligibility and benefit amounts are determined by number of U.S. residents or permanent residents in the household, household income, household size and Energy costs (fuel and electric bills). Household must be under 150% of the Federal Poverty Level. HEAT benefits are a one-time payment and will not cover your entire winter heating costs.

The HEAT Program is located in the BRAG Offices at 170 N Main in Logan.
