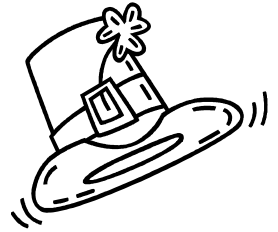

### CITY COUNCIL CORNER

Each month we will keep you informed of the City Council decisions from the previous month. In February:

- Approved an Eagle Scout Project for Trevor Hobbs to distribute surveys throughout the community for input on the City's Master Plan update.
- Approved having the 100 North Road built to the west allowing access to the new high school and Highway 165.
- Approved installing stop signs on 100 North 100 West for north and south bound traffic and removing the stop signs on 300 North 100 West.
- Heard a proposal for having a cell tower placed at approximately 450 North Main; there was no action taken by the Council.
- A presentation was made on the 2013 Water Audit by Superintendent Gary Larsen. The City produced 120.09 million gallons of water last year.
- Approved Rezoning property on Parcels 03-029-0015 and 03-029-0016 from residential to agricultural as requested by the Cache County School District.
- Approved the update to the City Zoning Map.
- Approved a business license for Crosssfit Iota South located in the Zollinger Complex at 1000 West 1000 North, Building 29.
- Discussed the RAPZ Grant proposal for 2014, requesting funds for additional improvements at the South Park around the splash pad area.
- Approved the revision to the signage ordinance along with a matrix identifying zones and sign types allowed.



### MILLVILLE GENERAL PLAN UPDATE SURVEY

The Millville City Council and Planning Commission are working to update the Millville General Plan. The General Plan is used to guide the City for the next 10 - 20 years to regulate the development and use of land, roads, etc. **Involvement from residents is essential** for the new plan to incorporate ideas and opportunities for the future needs of the City. The General Plan Committee has put together a survey to receive an impression of how residents feel about growth, parks and trails, etc. Residents' input will also be received at an open house, and public hearings before any decisions are made by the City Council. We encourage you to access this survey online. A link can be found at [millvillecity.org](http://millvillecity.org). The online survey will open March 13 – April 13, 2014. However, on **Wednesday, March 26<sup>th</sup> between 3-9 pm** printed surveys will be delivered, by boy scouts, to each household within Millville City limits, one per household. We ask that you complete this survey as quickly as possible. Within about an hour from the time of delivery, they will return to your home to pick up the completed survey. For multiple residents in household, additional surveys can be filled out online, or printed copies obtained by contacting Tara at the City Office 750-0924. Residents, age 16 and older, may participate in the survey.

If you are not home on that evening, a printed copy will be placed under the doormat. **Printed copy survey deadline is April 1<sup>st</sup>, 2014.** Please return them to the Millville City Office located at 510 East 300 South. The Office is open Tuesdays & Thursdays 10:00 am – Noon, or you can drop it in the utility bill drop box located in front of the City Office. The drop box will be checked daily. If it is more convenient to take the survey electronically, it can be accessed online at the City Website at [millvillecity.org](http://millvillecity.org). **Online (electronic) survey deadline is April 13, 2014.**

### 2014 DOG LICENSES

The 2014 Dog Licenses fees are now double! The deadline for licensing your dog was March 1, 2014. All dogs not registered by April 1<sup>st</sup> will be subject to citation by the Cache County Sheriff's Office Animal Control. Please mail your proof of rabies/proof of spay or neuter along with a payment to Millville City, P.O. Box 308, Millville, UT 84326 or drop it in the utility payment drop box at the city office. Up to three dogs, \$20 each if spayed/neutered and \$40 each if not spayed/neutered. Four to six dogs requires a kennel license fee of \$300. Six dogs is the limit!
