CITY COUNCIL CORNER

Each month we will keep you informed of the City Council decisions from the previous month. In March:

- Approved a business license for Kathy Kaye Foods, LLC in the Zollinger Complex at 1000 North 1000 West, Building #30.
- Signed a proclamation designating the month of April as Child Abuse Prevention Month.
- Discussed scheduling of City parks for baseball and soccer activities.
- Reappointed Jim Hart to serve on the Planning Commission for another term.
- Held a public hearing on the General Plan. There was an extensive discussion on this with several changes and comments on the draft expressed. This is ongoing and will be discussed again.
- Scheduled a public hearing on March 26, 2015 at 7:20 p.m. to hear comment on a rezone request made by Martha Balph to rezone parcels 03-037-0019, 03-037-0020, and 03-037-0055 from Open Space to Residential-I. The public hearing was held. Action will be taken on this request at the Council Meeting scheduled on April 9, 2015.
- Discussed a draft on an Interlocal Agreement between the City and Cache County School District. This is still being worked on.
- Approved funds to set up an Emergency Radio Operations Center at the City Office.
- Heard a report on the Youth Council activities. They were given a prestigious award and given a plaque at their Leadership Conference at Utah State University for the being the Youth Council showing the most enthusiasm, leadership, and team work at the conference. They also placed 5th in the Youth Council Challenge and was awarded \$50.
- Heard the 2014 Water Audit presented by Superintendent Gary Larsen. The City produced 105.47 million gallons of water last year, and had metered sales of 97.74 million gallons.
- Discussed the Establishment of a Recycling Market Development Zone.
- Also briefly discussed information about development in the Commercial Corridor and also whether to allow development on private roads.

2015 DOG LICENSES – FEES NOW DOUBLE

Please mail your proof of rabies/proof of spay or neuter along with a payment to Millville City, P.O. Box 308, Millville, UT 84326. The double fees are: Up to three dogs, \$20 each if spayed/neutered and \$40 each if not spayed/neutered. Four to six dogs requires a kennel license fee of \$300. Six dogs is the limit! MILLVILLE CITY NOTICE OF MUNICIPAL OFFICES TO BE VOTED ON

Millville City will hold a municipal election on November 3, 2015. There are three council seats for four-year terms that will be voted on. The councilmembers whose term of office will expire are: Michael Callahan, Cindy Cummings, and Mark Williams. The filing period will begin on June 1, 2015 and will conclude on June 8, 2015 at 5 p.m.

As outlined in the Utah State Code, the following outlines the eligibility requirements for those interested in declaring candidacy:

20A-9-203. Declarations of candidacy -- Municipal general elections.

(1) (a) (i) A person may become a candidate for any municipal office if:

(A) the person is a registered voter; and

(B) (I) the person has resided within the municipality in which that person seeks to hold elective office for the 12 consecutive months immediately before the date of the election; or

(II) if the territory in which the person resides was annexed into the municipality, the person has resided within the annexed territory or the municipality the 12 consecutive months immediately before the date of the election.

(ii) For purposes of determining whether a person meets the residency requirement of Subsection (1)(a)(i)(B)(I) in a municipality that was incorporated less than 12 months before the election, the municipality shall be considered to have been incorporated 12 months before the date of the election.

(b) In addition to the requirements of Subsection (1)(a), each candidate for a municipal council position shall, if elected from a district, be a resident of the council district from which elected.

(c) In accordance with Utah Constitution Article IV, Section 6, any mentally incompetent person, any person convicted of a felony, or any person convicted of treason or a crime against the elective franchise may not hold office in this state until the right to hold elective office is restored under Section 20A-2-101.3 or 20A-2-101.5.

NEW RESIDENTIAL OPEN BURNING REGULATIONS

Burn Permit Information – March 30th to May 30th

Open burning is a source of air pollution that is regulated by the Utah Division of Air Quality (DAQ). There are statewide rules in place that regulate open burning activities. Recent modifications to these rules change the open burn periods and include a statewide requirement to obtain a DAQ Online Open Burn Permit Application prior to burning.
