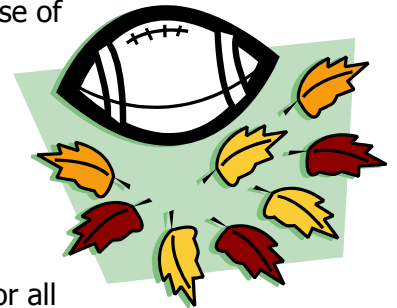

**CITY COUNCIL CORNER**

Each month we will keep you informed of the City Council decisions from the previous month. In August:

- Approved a minor subdivision identified as the Jacky Hancey Subdivision at approximately 5 South 550 East.
- Approved a business license request for The Horn Shoppe at 409 North Main as requested by Kevin Nettleton,
- Reappointed Lynette Dickey to serve as a Planning Commissioner.
- Discussed concerns regarding flies within the community.
- The splash pad is now in operation at the City Park across from the City Office.
- Approved a business license for Ashlie Jessop at 164 East 350 South to do hair.
- Approved an Eagle Scout Project for Keaton Kleven to clean up the city right of way near the south bridge going to the Maverik by removing weeds, branches, and cleaning the sidewalks and gutters.
- Cancelled the City Council Meeting to be held on September 11, 2014 because of training with the Utah League of Cities and Towns.
- Reviewed proposed Storm Water Fees for development

As we slide slowly out of summer and into fall this is a perfect opportunity for all of us in Millville to take stock and enjoy what a truly great place this is. The land is yielding up harvest from both our gardens and the agricultural fields around us, though the tomatoes are falling a bit behind schedule for most!

We've seen a lot of changes over the summer. The new High School is well under way now. After moving a truly impressive amount of dirt through the summer a steady stream of concrete trucks headed to the site is now becoming a daily occurrence. It's a sure bet that the construction crews would be delighted to have fall stretch out well beyond its normal time.

Millville continues to grow this year at a steady, comfortable rate. In addition to the several single family home permits issued and the school construction the Mond-Aire Heights subdivision just west of 550 East has started the permitting process and is making steady progress. This future addition will offer more people the opportunity to enjoy "Country living at its finest" for the foreseeable future.

Another great building project for all of us this year was the splash pad in the South Park, which appears to have been a hit since the day it opened. If you haven't taken time to try it out yet it you may want to move it up on your to-do list since it will be drained and shut down well before the coming first frost.

The City Council is working a number of concerns for all of this change, including the best way to handle the traffic and other infrastructure issues rising from the new school and homes. We're moving through these at a very deliberate pace to make sure that the quality of life we all enjoy here is not sacrificed in the process. One item that's been settled is the speed limit inside of the City. That limit is now 25 mph unless otherwise posted and brings us into alignment with the State speed restrictions. Fortunately this won't have much effect on the tractors moving through town. As always – input from each and all of you will be invaluable in making the best decisions in each case as we continue to move forward.
