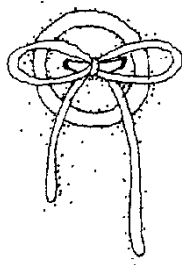

## CITY COUNCIL CORNER

Each month we will keep you informed of the City Council decisions from the previous month. In December:

- Approved a business license for Bridgerland Bookkeeping LLC at 90 West 400 North as requested by Karlette Johnson.
- Received and awarded bids on irrigation water share leases for 2011.
- Canceled the City Council Meeting to be held on December 23, 2010 because of the Christmas Holiday.
- Held a public hearing on December 9, 2010 at 7:15 p.m. to receive public input on: an ordinance Adopting Restrictions on the Manufacture, Distribution, Possession, or Use of Synthetic Cannabinoids; update of the Millville City Zoning Map. Both items were adopted.
- Received the Audit Report for fiscal year 2010 as presented by Scott Swensen of Jones Simkins.
- Reviewed the Culinary Water Source Feasibility Study presented by Engineer Zan Murray or J-U-B Engineering.
- Set the calendar for City events for 2011 as follows: Easter, April 23; Miss Millville, April 30; Old Mill Days, June 25; Night Out Against Crime, August 3; and Christmas, December 3. Be sure to mark these on your calendar and save the date.
- Set the annual meeting schedule for 2011 as follows: The City Council of Millville City will conduct regular meetings on the second and fourth Thursdays of each month with meetings beginning at 7 p.m. The Planning Commission will meet on the first Thursday of each month and also the third Thursday (as needed) with meetings beginning at 8 p.m.



The Appeal Authority will meet as needed. All meetings will be held at the City Office, 510 East 300 South, Millville, Utah, unless otherwise advertised. If the meeting date is on a legal holiday, the meeting shall be either canceled or rescheduled.

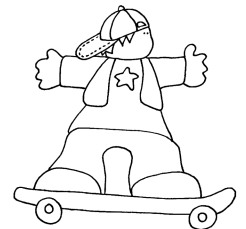

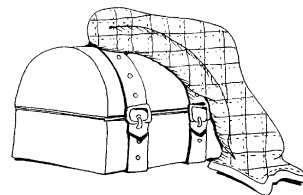

households throughout the state. Applications are taken from November 2 through April 2011, depending on funding levels. For more information call 752-7242.

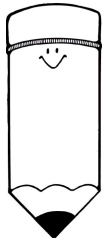
## POSTING PLACES FOR INFORMATION

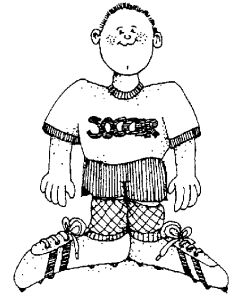
## 2011 DOG LICENSES



The 2011 Dog Licenses are here! Remember the deadline for licensing your dog is March 1, 2011. Fees double after that date. Please mail your proof of rabies/proof of spay or neuter along with a payment to Millville City, P.O. Box 308, Millville, UT 84326. Up to three dogs, \$7 each if spayed/neutered and \$18 each if not spayed/neutered. Four to six dogs requires a kennel license fee of \$120. Six dogs is the limit! **This year will be a little different** because the Millville mail slot is gone at the post office. If you mail in your dog license renewal you will have to pick up your tag and paperwork at the Millville City office during regular office hours, Tuesday and Thursday from 10am – 12pm. If you are unable to pick up the license at the city we will try to send it through the mail. Please allow two weeks to pick up your tag and paperwork after you send it in. ## NATIONAL CHILDREN'S STUDY

You may have seen a National Children's Study ad on a bus, the TV or radio. The National Children's Study – the largest long-term research study about how the environment affects children's health – is now enrolling eligible women here in Cache County! The study will help us understand why we are seeing an increase in chronic health conditions, like asthma, diabetes and autism, among children today. Led by Utah State University and the University of Utah, this research will help us understand how children's health interacts with the environments where they live, learn, and play. What we learn from the study will improve the health and well-being of children here in Cache County as well as nationally. We want to observe children's environments before they are born, so we invite pregnant women and those who are likely to become pregnant in the near future to join the study.
