## CITY COUNCIL CORNER

Each month we will keep you informed of the City Council decisions from the previous month. In March:

- Heard a presentation from the Child and Family Support Center and approved a proclamation designating April as Child Abuse Prevention Month.
- Approved a resolution establishing guidelines for Park Reservations and Facilities. All park reservations may be made starting the first business day of the calendar year.
- Approved the purchase of a plaque for the north pavilion at the City Park to acknowledge RAPZ monies granted for the building of the facility.
- Reviewed the annual Water Audit as presented by Superintendent Gary Larsen.
- Discussed the river project and progress made. The target date for reopening of the north bridge is this fall.
- Heard the Youth Council report as presented by Chelsie Winborg—reporting 22 members of our Youth Council attended the Youth Council Leadership Conference held at USU.
- Held a public hearing to receive input on a request to rezone parcels 02-089-0014, 02-089-0021, and 03-001-002 from agricultural to commercial as requested by Lance Zollinger. The rezone was approved by the Council.
- Approved an Ordinance to revise Chapter 17.08 Definitions and Chapter 17.20 Single-Family and Two Family Residential (R-1) in the Millville City Code.
- Approved a revision to the City Ordinance Chapter 17.44, Signage.
- Reviewed a petition to rezone parcel 03-001-0004 from agricultural to commercial for Zollinger Commercial Warehousing as submitted by Lance Zollinger. A public hearing was set for input on this request on April 26, 2012 at 7:10 p.m.

- Heard a presentation regarding the Community Emergency Response Teams Program which would train individuals to serve as volunteers in case of a disaster.
- Approved a business license for Kira Norr for Seuss on the Loose Preschool at 126 East 350 South.
- Appointed Molly Davidson as an advisor to the Millville City Youth Council.
- The chairs for the 'Old Mill Days' committee for the June 15-16 activities are Marjorie Davis, Liz Hadfield, and Luann Pehrson.
- A dumpster will be provided at the City Park to help with the City Cleanup beginning on April 16.
