CITY COUNCIL CORNER

Each month we will keep you informed of the City Council decisions from the previous month. In July:

- The Oath of Office was given to Mark Thacker to serve as a Councilmember through the end of the year.
- Approved the Law Enforcement and Animal Control Contracts with a 15% decrease requested in service.
- Reviewed a petition for annexation for five parcels located west of the railroad tracks and east of 800 West in Nibley as requested by Lance Zollinger. The petition will be processed for certification.
- Appointed Michael Dickman to serve on the Planning Commission as a Commissioner.
- Discussed with DeWitt Palmer a concern for trees in the city right of way that are damaged near his home on 100 West 200 North.
- Approve the 2011 Impact Fee Report showing the revenues and expenditures of impact fee monies.
- Reviewed a proposed Stormwater Ordinance.
- Discussed several points of consideration with regard to the Rocky Mountain Power Nibley Substation Project. Approved an agreement for .194 acre of property near the highline reservoir to be sold to Rocky Mountain Power for \$2,700.
- Discussed proposals being explored regarding the Blacksmith Fork River and the old river bridge.
- Reviewed the events for the Night Out Against Crime to be held on August 3.
- Heard an update on the Community Fair Booth representing us in the Cache County Fair. The committee for this is: Krista Melani, Susan Hancey, Lisa Johnson, Stacy Amberson, Kathryn Johnson, and Steve Kropp.

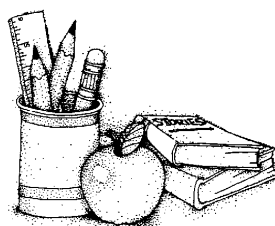
