10.08.010: PARKING OR BLOCKING STREETS OR HIGHWAYS

In addition to the parking provisions contained in the Utah Traffic Code, as adopted by this municipality, it shall be a class B misdemeanor for any person to:

- A. Remain standing, lying or sitting on any street or highway in such a manner as to obstruct the free passage of vehicular or pedestrian traffic thereon;
- B. Willfully remain standing, lying or sitting on any street or highway in such manner for more than one minute after being requested to move by any police officer;

- C. Willfully remain on such street or highway in such manner as to obstruct the free passage of any person or vehicle into or out of any property abutting upon the street or highway or any property having access to such street or highway. (Ord. 2022-4, 2022: Ord. 96-003 § 1)

10.08.020: AREAS WHERE PROHIBITED

- A. No person shall stop, stand or park a vehicle, except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with law or the directions of a police officer or traffic control device, in any of the following places:
 - 1. On or within one foot (1') of a sidewalk;
 - 2. In front of or within five feet (5') of a public or private driveway;
 - 3. Within an intersection;
 - 4. Within fifteen feet (15') of a fire hydrant;
 - 5. On a crosswalk;
 - 6. Within twenty feet (20') of a crosswalk at an intersection;
 - 7. Within fifty feet (50') from the closest edge of the pavement of an intersection on the City right-of-way;
 - 8. Within thirty feet (30') upon the approach to any flashing beacon, stop sign or traffic control signal located at the side of a street;
 - 9. On a roadway where the vehicle stopped or parked blocks the normal flow of traffic;
 - 10. Adjacent to any curb painted red;
 - 11. Upon the roadway side of another vehicle which is parked, standing or stopped except while actually engaged in loading or unloading passengers;
 - 12. At any place in any public park, playground or grounds of any public building other than on the roads or parking lots provided for public parking;

13. In any parking stall marked by painted lines unless the vehicle is entirely within such parking space or painted lines.

10.08.030: SIGNS

The governing body may authorize or direct any person employed by the municipality to erect or install any sign or traffic control device required to enforce the provisions of this chapter. (Ord. 2022-3, 2022: Ord. 96-003 § 1)

10.08.040: PARKING RESTRICTIONS DURING WINTER MONTHS

It is unlawful for the driver of any vehicle to park a motor vehicle on any street, or within ten feet (10') of roadway pavement in any municipal right-of-way unless such vehicle is in a driveway approach or otherwise parked behind the curb where curb exists between the first day of November of each year and the first day of April of the following year, for a period of time longer than fifteen (15) minutes when loading or unloading passengers and for a period of time longer than fifteen (15) minutes when loading or unloading or delivering property between the hours of twelve midnight and eight a.m. (Ord. 2022-4, 2022: Ord. 2000-8 § 2: Ord. 96-003 § 1)

10.08.050: SNOW REMOVAL

It is unlawful for any person removing snow from any parking lot, driveway, or sidewalk to push, blow, or otherwise deposit such snow onto the roadway of any public street or push it across said roadway in such a manner as to leave a residue or otherwise increase the amount of snow on the roadway. 10.08.060: PARKING IN EXCESS OF FORTY-EIGHT HOURS ON PUBLIC STREETS OR PROPERTY

No person who owns or has possession, custody or control of any vehicle shall park or leave standing any such vehicle on any public road, street, alley, right-of-way, or municipal property for forty-eight (48) or more consecutive hours. All persons who own or have possession, custody or control of such vehicles, must provide permanent parking on private property zoned for that purpose. Any vehicle so parked or left standing may be impounded and removed by law enforcement. For purposes of impoundment and removal, Law enforcement may impound and remove any motor vehicle which reasonably appears to have remained unmoved for forty-eight

(48) consecutive hours. The cost of impoundment and removal shall be charged to the owner or any person who claims the impounded motor vehicle. (Ord. 2022-4, 2022: Ord. 2000-8 § 2: Ord. 96-003 § 1)

10.08.070: PARKING RESTRICTIONS FOR RECREATIONAL VEHICLES, UTILITY TRAILERS AND AGRICULTURAL EQUIPMENT

- A. It is unlawful to park any recreational vehicle, including motor homes, camp and travel trailers, campers, boats, snowmobiles, four-wheelers, or unlicensed motorcycles, as well as utility, livestock, or construction trailers, or any agriculture-related implement, including tractors, combines, and swathers, on municipal roadsides, rights-of-way, easements, or other public property except for brief periods not to exceed twenty-four (24) consecutive hours. All persons who own or have possession, custody or control of such recreational vehicles, campers, and utility trailers, as well as agriculture implements and tractors, must provide permanent parking for such items on private property zoned for the purpose. Any item named herein so parked or left standing on the roadside or public right-of-way between private property lines on each side of the roadway may be subject to citation or impounded and removed by the city.
- B. For purposes of impoundment and removal, the city may impound and remove any recreational vehicle, camper, utility trailer, or agricultural tractor or implement which reasonably appears to have remained unmoved for twenty-four (24) consecutive hours. The cost of impoundment and removal shall be charged to the owner or any person who claims the impounded item. (Ord. 2022-4, 2022: Ord. 2000-8 § 2: Ord. 96-003 § 1)

10.08.080: PARKING FOR PURPOSE OF LOADING OR UNLOADING

When not otherwise posted or subject to another ordinance of Millville City, it is unlawful for the driver of a passenger vehicle to stand or park such vehicle for a period of time longer than necessary for loading or unloading of passengers, not to exceed fifteen (15) minutes. (Ord. 2022-4, 2022: Ord. 2000-8 § 2: Ord. 96-003 § 1)

10.08.090: PARKING OR OPERATING VEHICLES FOR CERTAIN PURPOSES PROHIBITED

No person shall park or operate a vehicle upon any roadway for the principle purpose of:

- A. Displaying such vehicle for sale;
- B. Greasing or repairing such vehicle except repairs necessitated by an emergency;
- C. Displaying advertising. (Ord. 2022-4, 2022: Ord. 2000-8 § 2: Ord. 96-003 § 1)

10.08.100: PLACING NO PARKING SIGNS WITHOUT CITY'S PERMISSION PROHIBITED

No person shall, without the permission of the municipal council, place or cause to be placed on any street or sidewalk or on any building any sign preventing or forbidding the parking of vehicles in the street in front of any building or place of business. (Ord. 2022-4, 2022)

10.08.110: OVERNIGHT CAMPING PROHIBITED

Overnight and extended camping is prohibited in any Millville City park or street and no tents or other temporary structures are to be erected for camping purposes on City property. (Ord. 2022-4, 2022)

10.08.120: LEFT SIDE TO CURB PROHIBITED

Except as otherwise provided in this section, every vehicle stopped or parked upon a two-way roadway shall be stopped or parked with the right-hand wheels parallel to and within eighteen inches (18") of the right-hand curb or, if there is no curb, as close as practicable to the right edge of the right-hand shoulder. (Ord. 2022-4, 2022)

10.08.130: ANGLED AND PARALLEL PARKING

- A. Only parallel parking on City Right-of-Way.
- B. Angle parking is permitted only on any street containing City-painted lines designating parking at an angle to the curb. (Ord. 2022-4, 2022)
